



How to assemble your DIY Pupa Chamber

- Gently remove pupa from the container
- Peel off the adhesive tape on the pupa and stick the pupa under the container's lid.
- Place tissue at the bottom of the container and mist inside the container before you place the lid on.

What to do if pupa drop

- Try to stick the pupa back on the lid.
- If the tape has lost its adhesive glue, change the double side tape or just put new double side tape on top of the old one and stick it back. It is very important for the pupa to keep hanging so the butterfly will have enough space to spread its wings and emerge beautifully.
- Place a twig inside the container in case you can no longer stick the pupa. The newly emerged butterfly will find its own way to climb to the twig.



Caution!

Handle the pupa gently. Do not squeeze or put too much pressure on the pupa as it might squirt liquid and will no longer be able to emerge.

Pupa Care

- Mist inside the container daily to keep it humid
- Make sure the pupa is hanging in the correct orientation
- Place the container in a well ventilated, shaded area

Signs of Emergence

- It has been 3-7 days
- The pupa has turned darker
- You can see wings & body formed inside the pupa
